Captain's Meeting – 7pm

The captain's meeting is mandatory. All boat registrations will be confirmed at the captain's meeting. All information regarding the rules and tournament details will be given at this time.

**Tournament Rules and Regulations:**

1. All vessels must be registered at the mandatory Captain's meeting held at the Marina Cafe.

2. Boats will be checked out at three locations (Sneads Ferry, Jacksonville, Swansboro) locations the morning of the tournament. Weigh-in location is at New River Marina. All boats must return under their own power.

3. All fish entered for prize consideration must comply with North Carolina State fishing regulations. North Carolina fishing licenses are required for all anglers for salt and fresh water (applies if fishing in both bodies of water). All boats will have adequate safety gear and ensure that everything is operable on-board. Captains are responsible for all anglers on their vessel.

4. The entry fee is \$150 per boat (includes logoed gift). All persons fishing on the boat must be listed on the registration form.

5. Live fish for weigh-in are encouraged. All live fish in good condition will be released back into the wild by tournament staff. Let's all practice conservation for the fish we catch. Otherwise, fish must be in good edible condition and properly iced. Fish must be properly landed. Fish that appear to have been harpooned, gaffed, mutilated, shot or cast/gill netted will be refused.

6. This is an aggregate weight, 4 fish limit shootout.

7. All contestants will, in every respect, catch any fish offered for prize consideration in a sportsmanship manner, obeying all rules and regulations of the tournament.

8. Scales open at 3:00pm and close at 4:00pm, Saturday, October 23, 2021. Any boat that has not checked in at the weigh-in designated area by 4:00pm will be disqualified.

9. In case of equal weight, the boat that enters their catch first will be declared the winner of that position.

10. All decisions of the tournament committee will be final.

11. Tournament participants are subject to a polygraph, at the discretion of the tournament committee, for cash prizes.

12. All prizes will be awarded immediately following the final weigh-in and calculations.

13. Participants enter at their own risk. Neither the tournament, nor any person or entity connected with the tournament, shall be held liable for any loss, damage, negligence, hazard, or injury to anyone for any reason. The tournament board reserves the right to postpone/reschedule the tournament due to unforeseen weather conditions.

14. At captains meeting any rule interpretations are final.

15. Boundaries: inshore waters only.
