Chad Fonville – Chad Everett Fonville was born in 1971 in Jacksonville, NC. Chad was an outstanding White Oak High School athlete from 1988 to 1990, earning All-Conference and All-County honors in baseball, basketball and soccer. Chad was drafted by the San Francisco Giants in 1992, via their minor league team, then again by the Montreal Expos in 1994. Chad moved to the Los Angeles Dodgers, helping win the Division Championship by stealing 20 bases and batting .276. That year, Chad received the Ed Enterline Memorial Award; he placed seventh in the voting for the prestigious Rookie of the Year Award. When his time ended with the Boston Red Sox in 1999, having played for the Chicago White Sox, Cleveland Indians, New York Mets, and Colorado Rockies, Chad's minor league career produced a batting average of .270, collecting 701 hits and 192 stolen bases. He spent the better part of four seasons in the majors, averaging .244, making 133 hits and stealing 30 bases.

Chad began his second career in Onslow County at Brewster Middle School. Chad then became Head Baseball Coach at Camp Lejeune High School, taking on responsibilities as Assistant Coach for basketball, football and soccer. After a stint as a coach at White Oak, Chad went back to Lejeune High School as a Special Needs Teacher's Aid and Assistant Baseball Coach, molding future baseball stars.
